HUI Ā-TAU25 E PAO, TŌREA!





PŪTAIAO WORKSHOP He Whare Pūrākau August 2025 | Auckland

This two-day workshop engaged participants in an exploration of Pūtaiao through a Māori worldview, focusing on pūrākau and maramataka while highlighting the value of integrating mātauranga Māori into the teaching of Pūtaiao, to create culturally grounded and authentic learning experiences for ākonga.

KA HOKA Leadership Workshop August 2025 | Wellington




